If you haven't been around the club for a while, we have had a big project going on. The concrete pad, ramp, and path from the cart barn was completed in late November. With this we added curbing around the main pad and the paths going to the first and tenth tee boxes. The aim is to keep the heavy cart traffic off the grass to increase the course appeal from the club house. The project will resume in the spring with a new ramp/turnaround to the bar and new carport concrete/sidewalk in front of the building. In early January we will be replacing our shingle façade along our roof line with seamless metal roofing. Over the past few years, we have had a hard time of keeping shin-

gles on the building and this will provide a longterm solution. We have also enlisted the help of a designer to give us some options for a clubhouse facelift if desired. Exciting things are happening at our club!

er by Carl and Devin then evaluated by the Long-Range Planning Committee. These are outside the more routine things that need funding (course maintenance equipment, golf carts) but still should be considered and addressed in due time. The intent is to do things the correct way and not just put band aids on problems. So, while "yes", we can add more sand to bunkers; doing so isn't fixing the problem and inconsistencies in the bunkers will remain.

My focus for the next couple of years will be course drainage and parking lot improvements. Both require a lot of coordination with the local governments so both will take some time. (If anyone has firsthand insight in to how to navigate these waters, please reach out to either Carl or myself) The goal is to have all the pieces in place to be ready to pull the trigger if that becomes the direction of the board. Not knowing what either project will cost right now makes it tough to make promises. But my hope is that if MCC continues to operate the way we have the past few years these projects can be funded by the club. And if not fully at least a partial contribution with the rest coming from member fundraising.

Carl and Parker did an excellent job of tracking rounds and revenue in 2022. MCC had to be closed 9 golf days because of the course being too wet/ drainage issues. An additional 4 days were walking only. Because of these closures, it is estimated that Maplecrest lost almost \$14k in golf revenue. Not an earth-shattering number by any means, but good information to have to make informative decisions.

The Greens Committee marked 9 trees for removal last summer which will be taken down this winter. The majority are old and dying but there are two marked for playability and to spread tee box wear. I think the biggest concern is the tree on hole 6 which comes into play for the men off the tee. I want to reassure everyone that decisions like these are not done on a whim. A lot of thought, effort, discussion, and time is put into these decisions. Specifically with this hole and tree, a lot has changed over the years. Originally in 1961 the tree didn't come into play. The green was redone in the mid 80's and expanded to the north. Also, the hole was shorter. The official yardage marker was moved 12 yards further back in the 90's, bringing the tree even more into play. Men (even slicer's) almost exclusively tee off from the south side of the tee box which leads to a lot of wear and tear. Once sanded and repaired, over time it crowns the south side of the tee box due to the buildup. The past changes led to an unintended problem. The 2023 budget has the funds to replace trees in the fall to make sure they are being placed in the best spots for both playability and course maintenance. And as always, you can donate to the memorial tree fund at any time to help honor members that are no longer with us.

In November the board approved a 5% increase to dues for 2023. The board also approved the continuance of the capital fund at 10% of dues for the year. Over the past 7 years the Maplecrest board has used the Consumer Price Index to evaluate and adjust. Since the last evaluation in late 2021 the CPI has increased 7.75% and Maplecrest continues to see costs increase. The hope is the inflationary pressures will at least slow and MCC will be able to absorb the difference in the short term. The greatest effect will be a \$159 increase for 2023 for a Family Membership.

Finally, I would like to thank Kare Andersen, Kevin Graber, and Frank Leftwich for their time, effort, and contributions to the board. It started off rocky in 2020, but a lot was achieved and Maplecrest is in a better spot today. I would also like to thank Roger Huffman, Olivia Kauffman, and Randy Rhoade for running for the board. Looking forward to a fantastic 2023!
